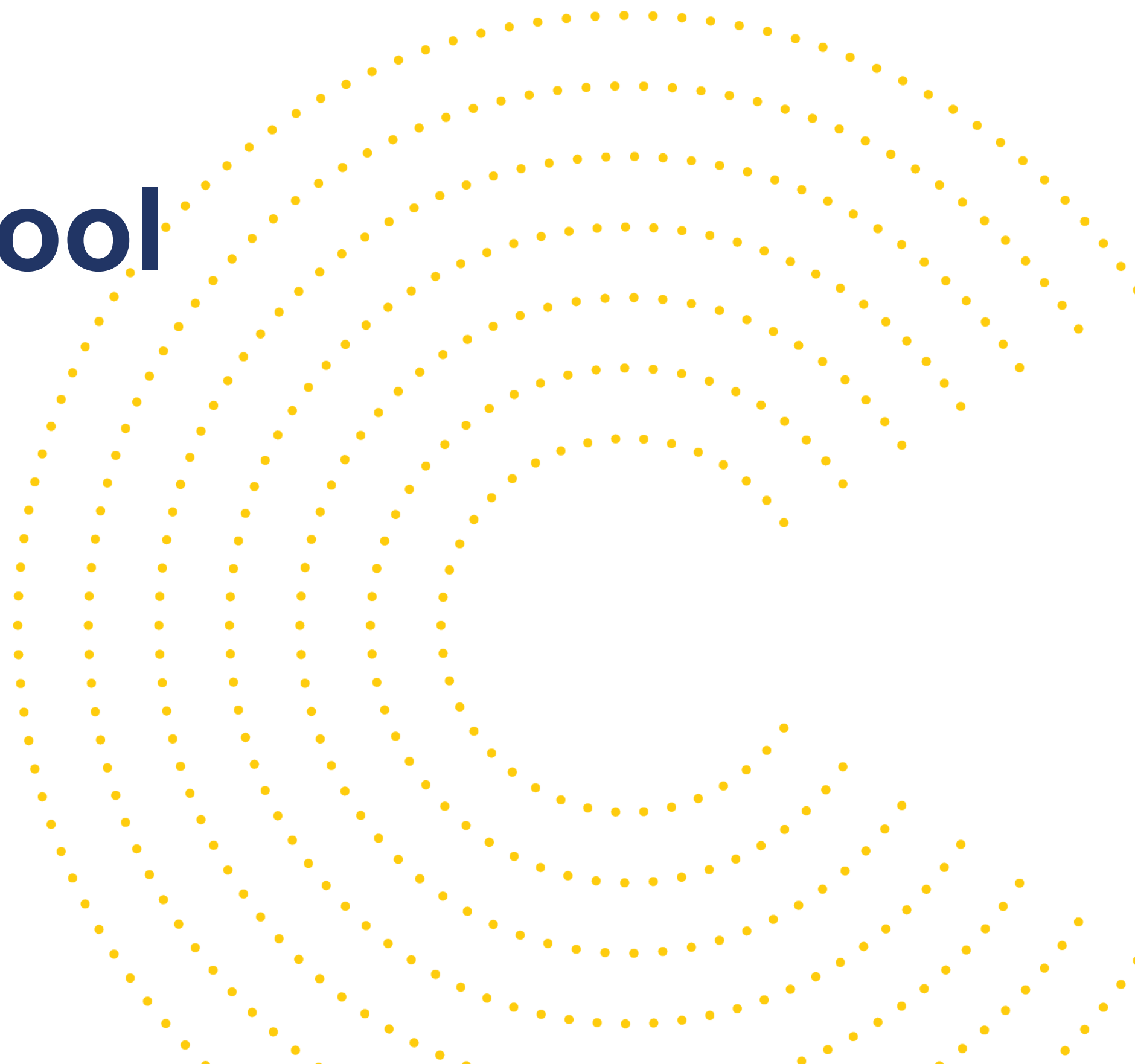

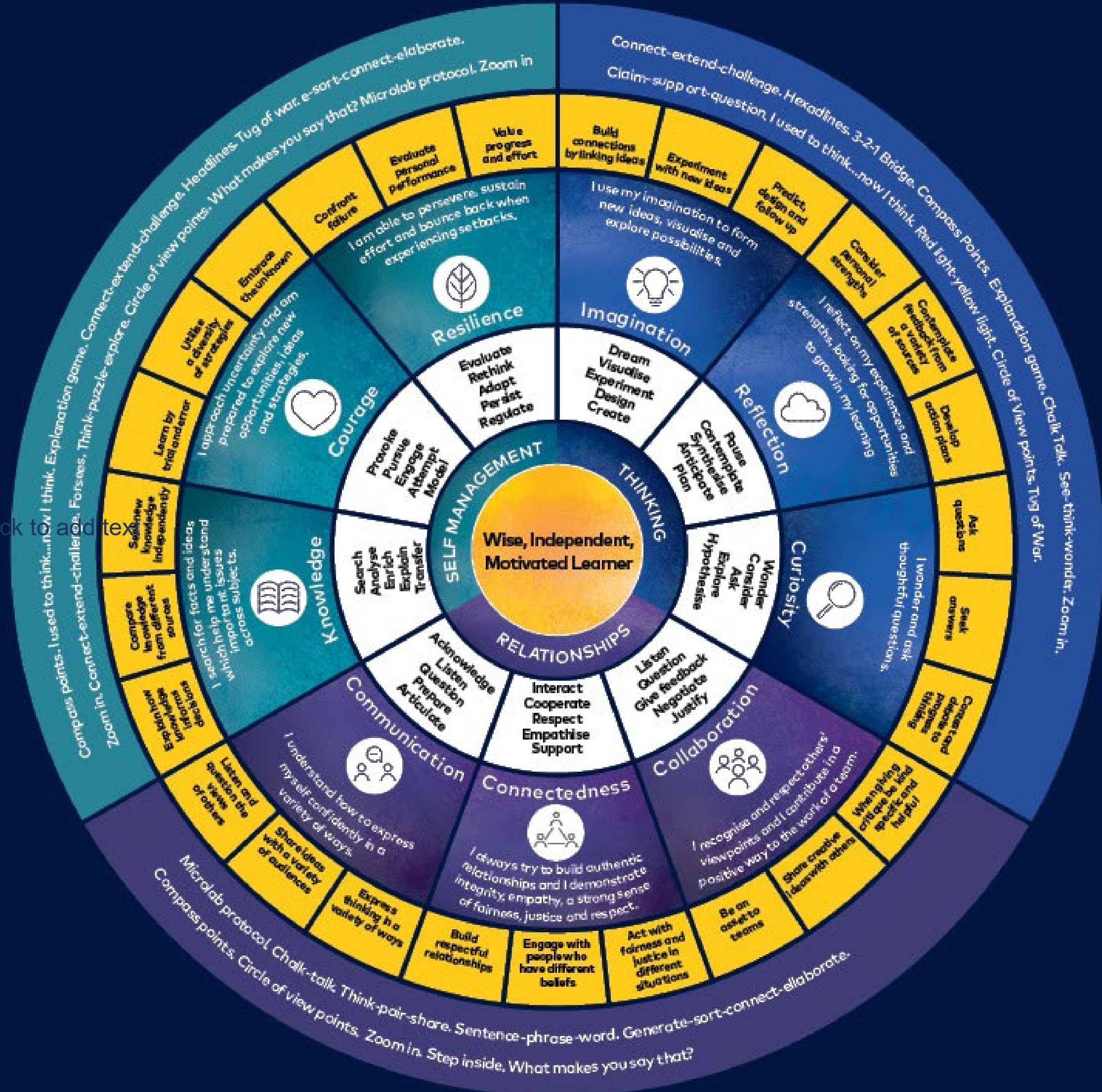

Practise physical distancing when possible



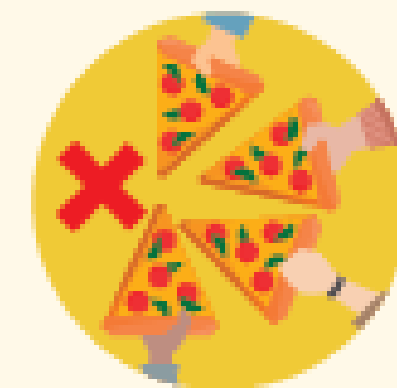
Wash your hands well and often

26.1% of ATAR scores were **above 95** (22.0% in 2020)

42.6% of ATAR scores were **above 90** (40.2% in 2020)

The Carey median ATAR is **87.7** (85.4 in 2020)

65% of all ATAR scores were **80 or above** (63% in 2020)

Carey IB Average score of **38.4 (ATAR 96+)**

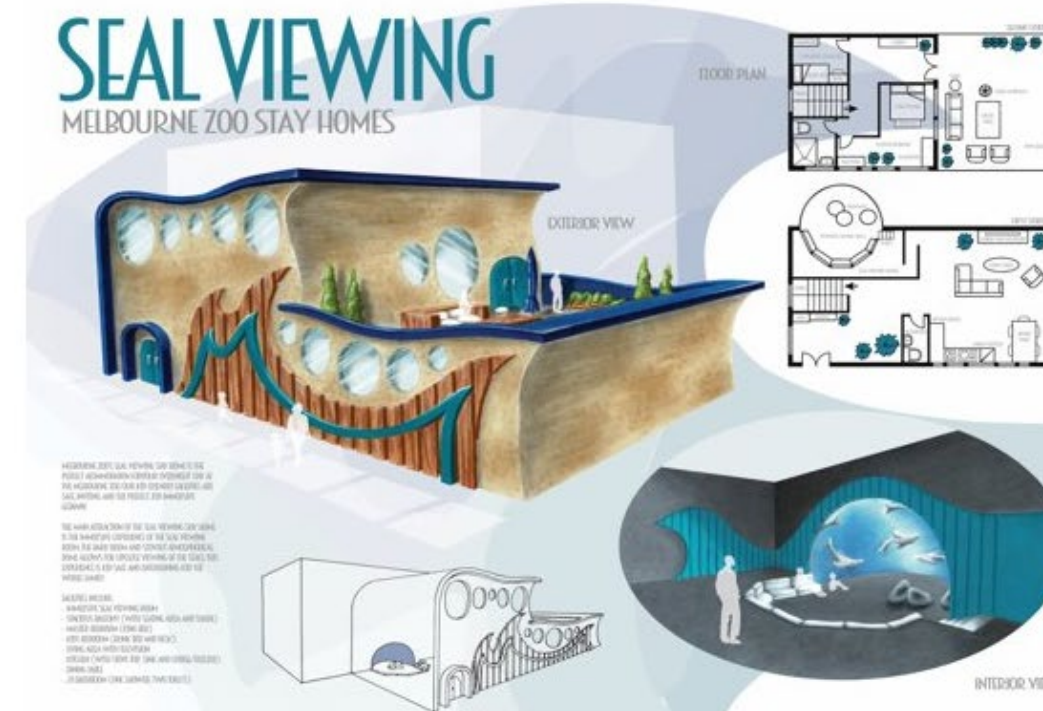

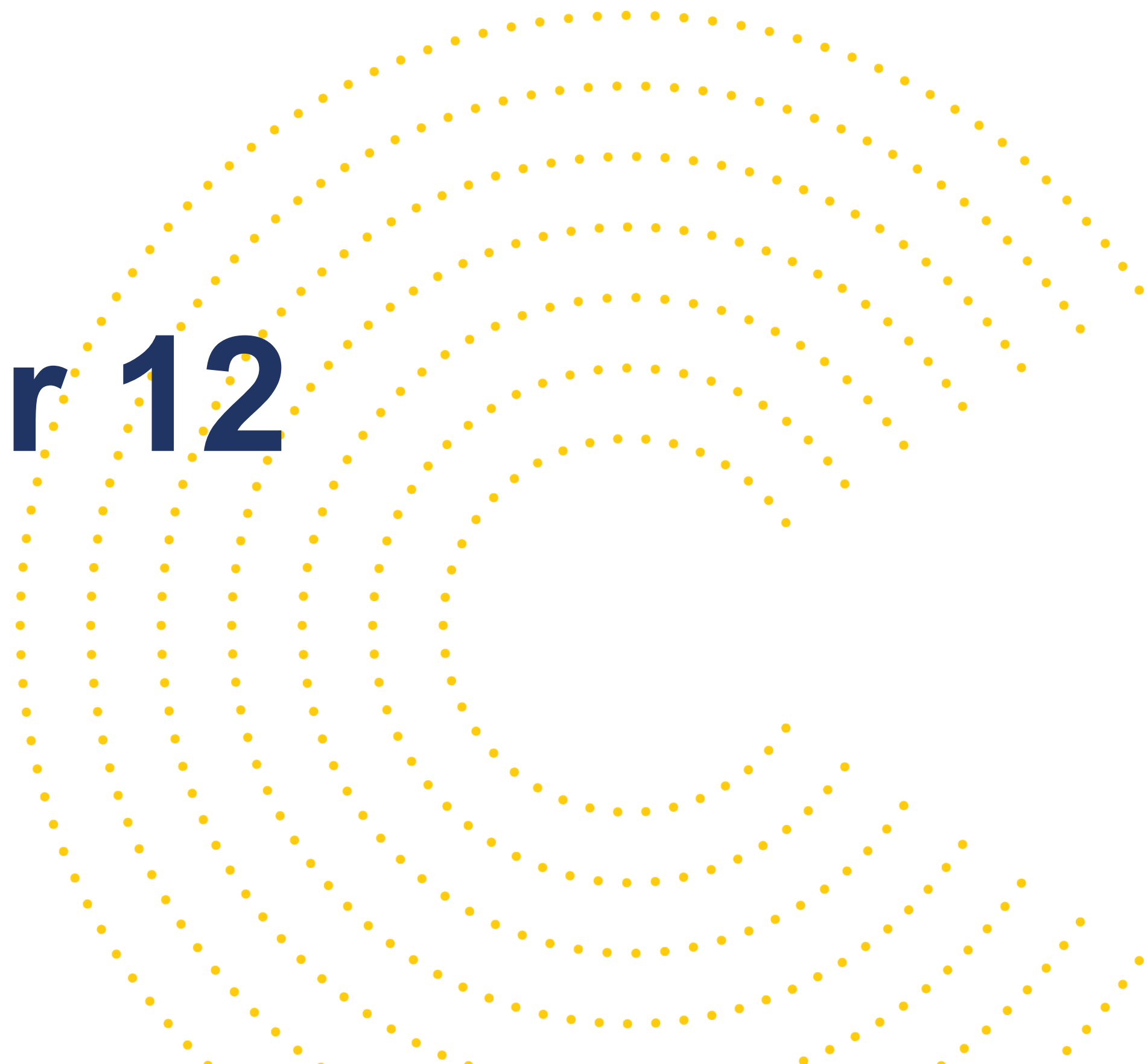

# Contributions to the ATAR

- The ATAR is calculated using **three Graded Assessments** for each subject;
- Internal assessment Unit 3 and 4 and External exam.
- Internal Assessment, External exam Paper 1 and Paper 2
- Internal assessment, Performance/Oral exam and External exam.



# School Assessed Coursework (SAC)

- SAC (internal assessment) results rank the students
- SACs and End of Year exams combine to provide a Study Score (50)
- Study scores are **moderated** by exam performance of the group and the GAT

# Too sick to sit a SAC?

- Students must provide a medical certificate **for the day of the SAC**
- If illness is COVID related, then the Department of Health text is sufficient

# Following excuses not acceptable and may result in a zero result...

- Misread their SAC schedule
- They slept in
- They missed their tram
- They felt unwell but did not have a valid Doctor's certificate
- They didn't feel prepared for the SAC so did not attend
- They have submitted work which could not be authenticated as their own work
- Download essays from Google



# School-Assessed Tasks

In addition to coursework (SAC's),

Art, Studio Arts, Media, Visual Communication and Design also have School-Assessed Tasks (SATs):

Extended task set by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA), marked by teachers and subject to review





# Individual SAC and SAT schedules

- Available on **CareyLink**
- Will try to avoid 3 or more on one day
- Reschedule if 3 **different** subjects on the same day
- Submission of SATs do not count as a 3<sup>rd</sup> SAC



# How is the internal assessment mark moderated?

- Every school sets their own internal assessments
- VCAA use the examination results of a group to determine the scores for these students
- In some cases the group results will be increased after moderation(SACs were more challenging than the exam)
- Others will be decreased (SACs were less challenging than the exam)

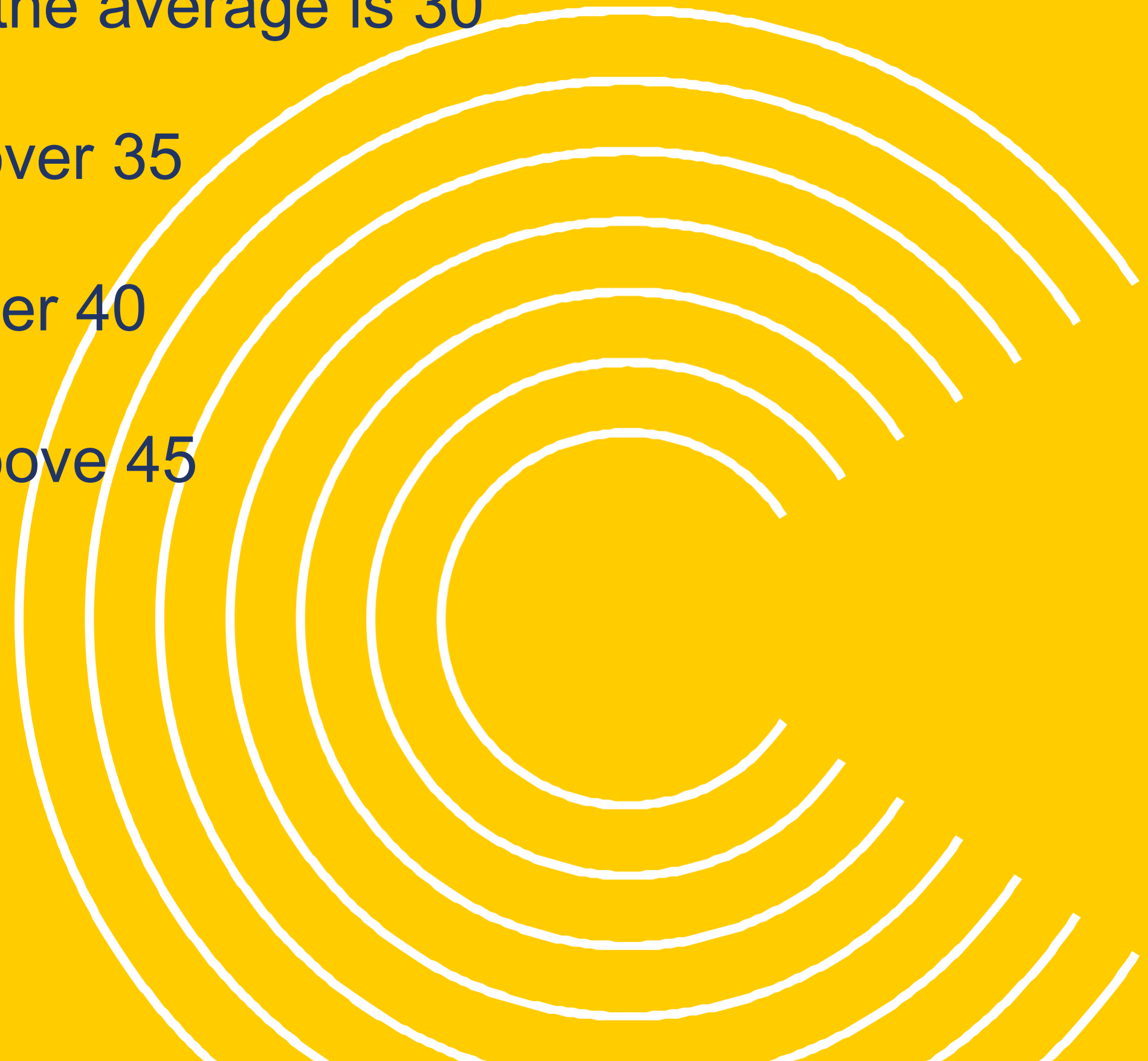

# Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking (ATAR)

- Reported as a percentage to indicate where a student is ranked against all other students in the State.
- Is calculated by combining the study score of:
  - ❑ English, EAL, English Language or Literature
  - ❑ Next best (permissible) three study scores
  - ❑ 10% of any fifth and/or sixth study score (may be University extension or VET 3-4)

# General Achievement Test (GAT)

**Wednesday 7 September 10.00am-1.15pm**

- All Year 12 IB and VCE students sit the GAT
- Any other VCE student studying a Unit 3-4 Subject





# GAT is used as.....

- Trigger for exams to be remarked if the GAT predicted grade and exam do not correlate
- Confirm or review Carey SAT scores
- **Derived Examination Scores (if advantageous)**
- Moderation of statewide SAC scores



# Mid-Year and September Internal Examinations

- No mid-year exams for Year 12 VCE to provide more opportunities for SAC completion
- **Trial Exams, last week of the Term 3 break 26 September – 30 September**
- Important for feedback, review and practise for end of year exams
- Still time to make significant adjustments to the learning and review of course content

# VCAA Special Exam Arrangements – end of Term 1

Must have medical evidence

Some possible medical conditions and arrangements:

- **Anxiety disorders** - rest breaks, permission to take medication
- **Autism spectrum disorder** - rest breaks, permission to leave exam room under supervision
- **Diabetes** - permission to take food/drink into exam, take medication, leave the room under supervision
- **Learning disabilities** - need documentation and testing. Our LD team are best placed to make these recommendations

# SEAS - Special Entry Access Scheme

- Apply through VTAC once preferences are entered, in early **August**
- Long term illness or disadvantage
- Some tragedy or illness during Year 12 or earlier that has impacted learning
- Elite sports to individual Universities
- See Careers advisors for further discussion later in the year

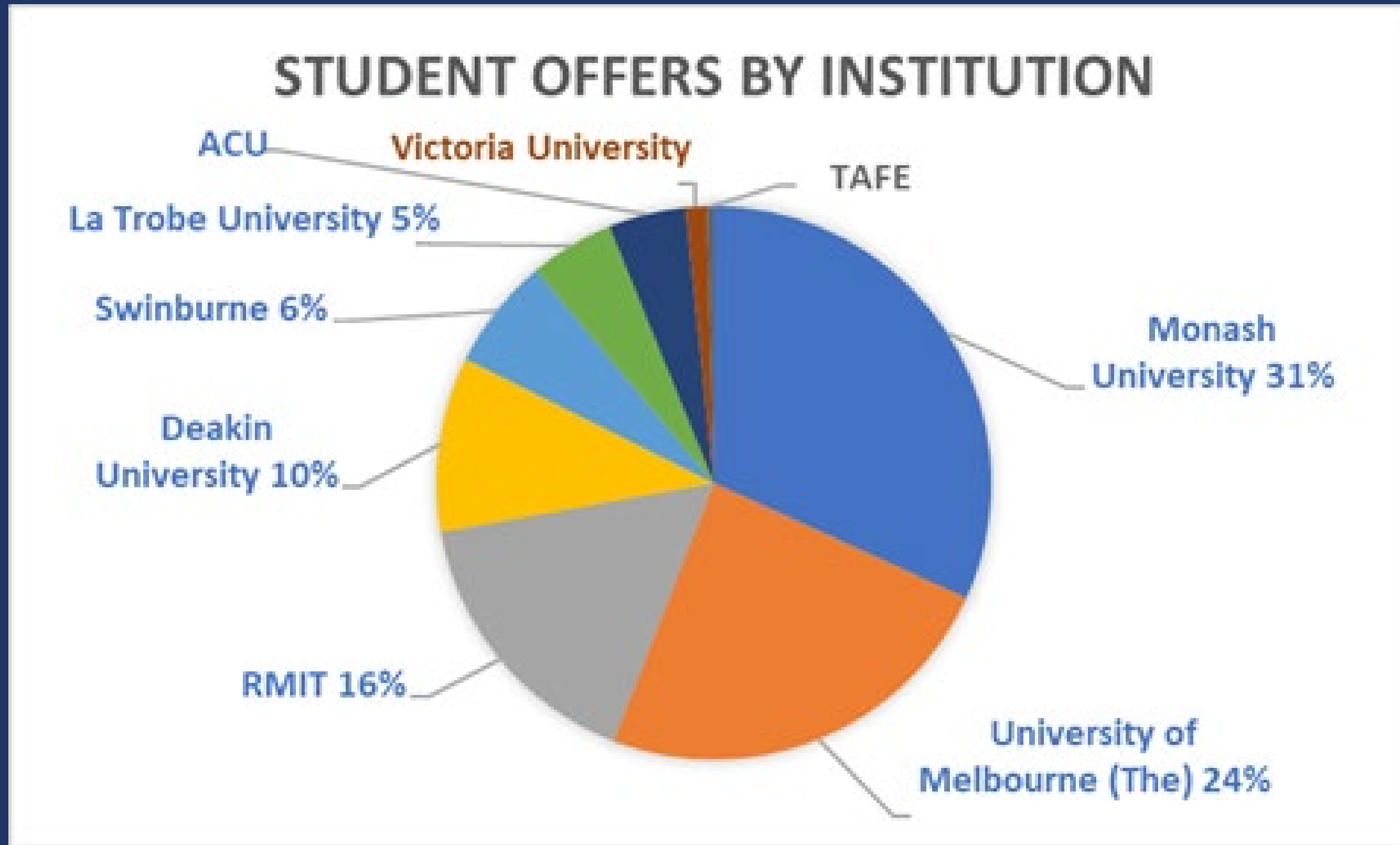

# Key Statistics

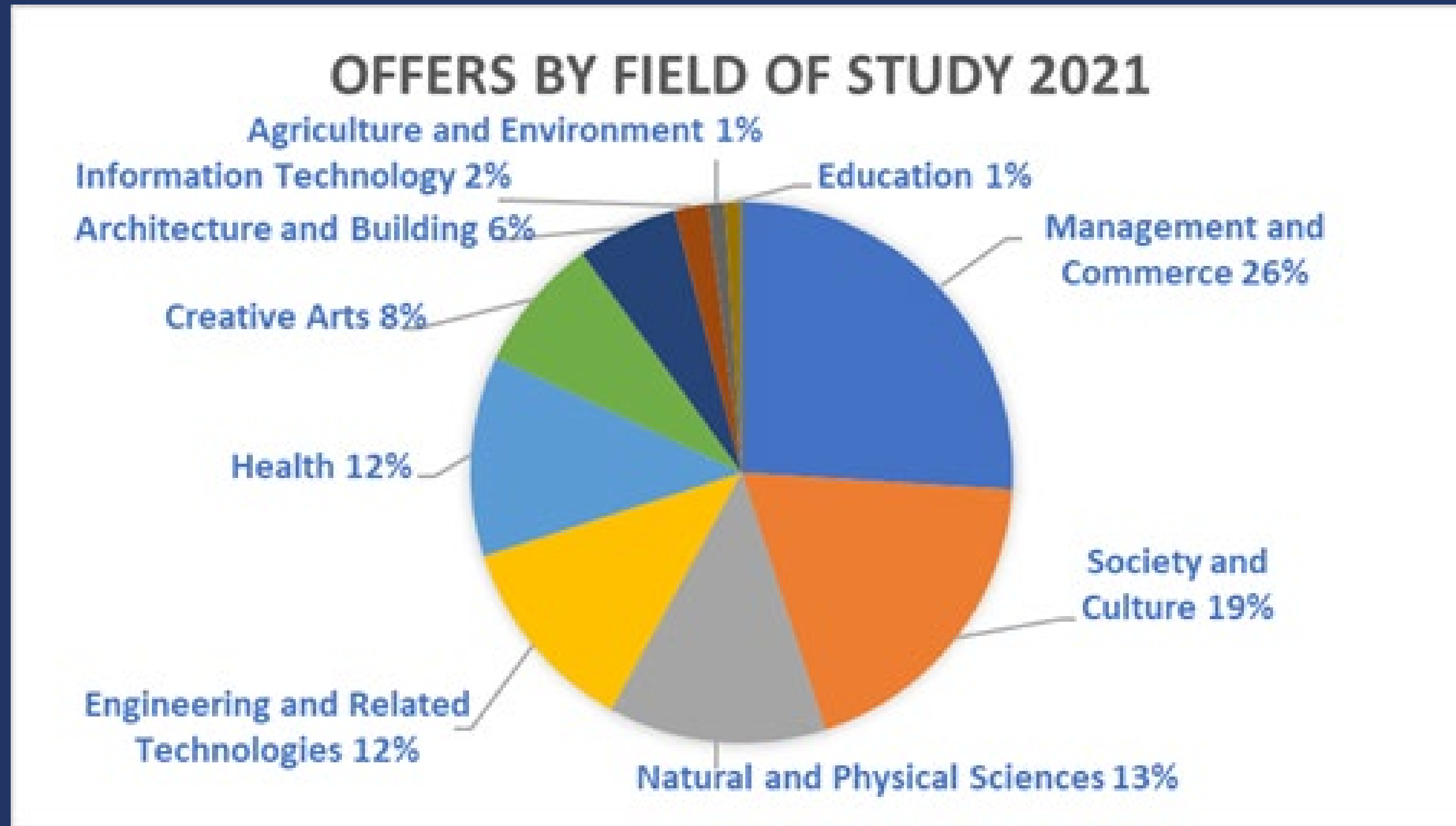
- 258 students completed Year 12 at Carey in 2021
- 252 Year 12 students registered with the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) and applied for courses
- 251 have received an offer
- Almost 2 out of 3 students got their first preference and 97% of students received an offer in their top 4 preferences

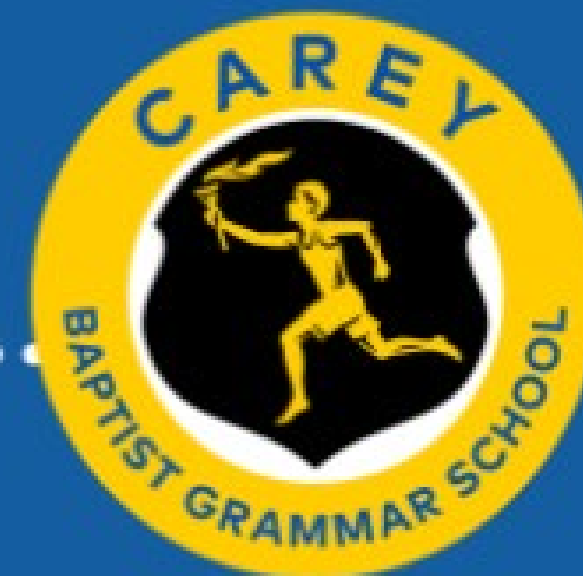


# How can parents provide support?
